In John 14, Pastor Dave talked about Jesus "bequeathing" peace to his disciples (through the presence of the Holy Spirit). In your Last Will and Testament, if you could "bequeath" an attribute that you possess rather than a possession, what would you be able to "leave" to your friends and family? (examples: joy, patience, discipline, etc.)

Pastor Dave concluded the entire "Just Jesus" series by sharing a glimpse of Jesus in every book. Have you ever thought about how we can see Jesus throughout the Old Testament? What stood out to you from that list that Dave shared?
