APPLICATION

In this week's God at Work video, a line from a song was quoted that said, "I searched the world, but it couldn't fill me." What are some the ways in which people try to be filled by the world? With which one might you be tempted to wrestle?
In Ephesians 3:1-13, the word "mystery" is used numerous times. What is this mystery that Paul is referring to? Why was is it a mystery? What most interested you in what you learned about God's plan for revealing the mystery?
